





The tables were filled with great models and some categories in Armor and Aircraft had to be split due to the number of entries.

The Gunpla and figure categories were judged separately.














The quality of the work was outstanding with a lot of imagination going into the presentation of each Gundam.

Armor models were well represented with excellent work all around.










This peice was believe it or not in 1/48 scale and was judged Best armor.








Best Aircraft and Best of Show was this excellent 1/32 Dauntless

Milton left over 200 started model kits. This is the first year of a three year project to honor him by finishing as many of his started projects as we can. Enjoy!












# Shipping News by Rick Herrington



# Vee Hobby is eleasing rhe USS New Jersey.






Aoshima is rre-releasing the DKM Tirpitz.






Fujimi has some amazing art work on their kits.

Last in the column is in 1/200 scale from Hobby Boss. They are releasing the PHM Pegasus.





Howdy tread heads! No 1/72nd to speak of this month so we'll stick to 1/35 and 1/16. Dragon has the lion's share of the re-releases. Let's start off with one of their superb Tiger 1 kits. This one is labelled Wittman's last Tiger referring to the Tiger ace Michael Wittman. The kit includes zimmerit, a metal barrel and a bonus figure of Michael. The kit was originally issued in 2018.



Next from Dragon is another Tiger 1 labelled as Villers Bocage. This is another chock full of bits kit with zimmerit, a metal barrel and photo etch.





Tiger Models also has a LeClerc for us.




Border Models has a Sdkfz 251/22 with a 75mm Pak gun mounted on it.

Dragon is also re-releasing a Sdkfz 250 with a 20mm turret.






Next up from Dragon is a 251C with a short barreled 75mm gun mounted on it.

The second release from Hobby Boss is a BMD-2




The third is a Type 59 PLAN medium tank.
