

I did a review on Tamiya's last release of German Infanry figures and was highly pleased. The detail and poses were exceptional for plastic figures so I when I saw this set on display at Nationals I was looking forward to its release.














I just used two of the figures from the set and a figure from the previous German army figures set.. (the figure with the raised hand)

This month's contest was the final Bondo competition. Tim Robb was the winner with his H--tech Mystere IV marked as an Israeli aircraft. Congratulations Tim!




