# A Tale of Two Challengers by Rick Herrington






1/72nd scale is rewarding to work with if you're an armor builder. The kits are usually half of the price you'd pay for a 1/35th scale kit and have far less fiddly bits than their 1/35th brothers.

In the middle of building a Tamiya 1/35 Challenger 2 Desertised I had an extended stay in the hospital. After I returned home I was not up to picking up where I left off with the 1/35th kit but I was still interested in completing a Challenger. Searching through my stash I came up with a one and a half kits of a Challenger 2 by Dragon and a Revell Challenger 1.





While perusing the web found a newly released Academy 1/72 Challenger 1 which I promptly ordered along with a Dragon KFOR Challenger with a dozer blade.



Academy's "New tool" 1/72 Desert Storm Challenger 1 kit. On the hull there is a manufacturing stamp from Ace models.

No matter who manufactured it the kit still builds up well.



Builds on all these kits are straight forward. I built the Academy kit as an Operation Granby machine, The Dragon Challenger 2 with dozer was built up as a vehicle participating in the Kosovo (KFOR) action.

I added some extras in the way of stowage made from Epoxe putty and sheet styrene. The orange air identification panel was made with Magic Sculpt. (epoxe putty).





The Dragon instructions on the dozer blade assemby are a little rough so I assembled it as I thought it should be . I did find some web images that helped out in the assembly.









These kits were a lot of fun for me, so much so that I went out and bought a Trumpeter Challenger 2 with dozer blade in 1/35th scale. I'm not a big fan of Trumpeter's armor kits but it did have the dozer blade assembly in the kit and I can add that to the RFM or Tamiya kit which I plan to do.

# Rivercon XIV 2025..a trip to visit our Louisiana neighbors by Tim Robb

It was a Saturday in March. The day dawned chilly and clear after a light overnight rain. The promise of great models to see, vendors to visit, and fellow modelers to meet held Tim in keen anticipation......oh wait, this isn't a novel.

OK. I made the trip to Shreveport for my first RiverCon and had a good time at a very well run event. The location was the University Center building on the LSU Shreveport campus, and it's a great venue. Lots of nearby parking and there are 7-8 rooms available upstairs for model display, a ballroom, auditorium with theater seating, and dining room with "The Port" snack bar downstairs.



The vendors were spread about the wide lobby and hallways downstairs. I was told the ballroom had been used as the vendor room at previous events but this year's floorplan came about by vendor consensus request. It worked well, modelers were in the vendor area almost immediately upon entering the building.

The competition was judged using standard IPMS rules with 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place medals awarded for each category. There were 84 entrants for a total of 518 models. The largest categories were Aircraft (125), Armor (109), Automotive (102). Entrants came from Louisiana 38, Texas 25, Arkansas 5, Oklahoma 3, and one each from Alabama and Tennessee. Richard Kern entered 64.



Brandon Porter of Alamo Squadron won best armor with a 1/72nd piece and also the "Call of the Wild" Theme award and best aircraft with a 1/32 scale AH-1G Cobra helicopter. Best Figure went to a Scottish highlander. I didn't get all the best ofs and winners recorded, however, they will be posted soon on the Red River Scale Modelers Facebook page.







. Mike Lamar of ASMS took 1st and 2nd in 1/48 single engine Axis with a pair of FW-190s, and 1st and 2nd in 1/72 single engine Axis with a pair of Ki-84s, and perhaps more I didn't get recorded. Beautiful models Mike.


Bud Lindemann's re-purposed automotive Special award.

Just wanted to give everyone an update on what is going on out at ABIA. For those of you who were at the January meeting, the club voted to purchase the missing aircraft for the display that were identified by Ron.

If I recall the count is close to a dozen aircraft that will need to be acquired and built. Ron has already noted that he is not going build all of them so we will need volunteers to build these once they become available.

Talking about volunteers, there are some other needs for this project. I have setup dates for the rest of the year for conservator trips to the airport and wanted to share them in hopes of getting folks to raise their hands and come out for one of these.

These dates are all on Friday afternoons with a start time of around 1pm and typically lasts about two hours. Parking at the airport will be taken care of if you bring in your parking ticket. Looking for at least one, maybe two individuals per date. Any more than that and we will be stepping on each other.

Here are the dates for this year: 5/2, 6/13, 7/25, 9/12, 10/24, 12/12

Another thing that could use a hand is doing some research. The current thought is that all these aircraft might possibly have a page on the US Air Force Museum website. We have talked about collecting these links and then providing airport visitors with a barcode that can be scanned so that they can learn more about the aircraft.

The last project is the conservatorship aspect. The airport staff would like us to create some kind of documentation/log for each model. For the exisitng some of the details may be non-existent, but for the new ones capture details right down to who built it for the history.





## New and In View Aircraft by Ron McCracken

March is a month of re-pops. Of particular interest this month are a couple of new (to me, at least) outfits who've re-released a slew of variants of some popular subjects. The first of these is Wingsy Kits, a Ukrainian company founded in 2016. They specialize in the ever-popular 1/48th scale. For the teeny-scale fans, FoxOne is re-popping a number of 1/144th kits, including variants of the T-6 Texan II.

1/35th Scale:

Trumpeter has re-released their CH-47A kit as an ACH-47A Armored Chinook with new parts.






